

#### **UP THE JUNCTION**

Two busy West End roads have made it into Leicester's top ten league of accident blackspots over a five year period.

The Fosse Road North/Blackbird Road and Groby Road Junction shared the number one spot with the Soar Valley Way/Lutterworth Road and Glenhills Way junction which both suffered 27 car crashes over the last five years.

In at number four with 26 accidents is the stretch on Narborough Road between Noel Street to Stuart Street and straight in at number eight with twenty-two collisions is the Upperton Road/ Narborough Road Junction.



### **Dovelands In The Top Ten!**

Dovelands Primary School is now in the top 10 primary schools in Leicester for English and Maths.

The school moved from 46th in the Local Authority to 10th in 2015, for the Key Stage 2 result in maths, reading and writing combined for Year 6 children. Ninety per cent of children achieved a level 4 or higher in reading, writing and maths, and



29 per cent achieved a level 5 in all 3 subjects. Headteacher, Sara McAdam said: "This is better than the national level and better than our results in 2014.

"It has been an incredible year for Dovelands! The changes we have made have continued to put children's progress at the centre of our focus and are having a huge impact – taking us into the top ten primary schools in Leicester for English and Maths".

The school also took part in more sporting tournaments than ever before, including table tennis and girl's football, and a year five boy came first in the Leicester City Schools cross country event.

## Down By The River

**Rivers have been very much in the news over these past few weeks.** They are often seen as the source of a great deal of flooding and consequently flood damage.

However, there is also a view that they harbour important flood plains. The latter have too often been used as the sites for foolhardy building developments, which themselves aggravate the flood problems.

Our rivers have for centuries been major arteries of transport and trade. Until comparatively recently they provided for much quicker and more reliable travel than moving about by road.

Here in Leicestershire the River Soar was an outlet to the North Sea via the Trent, whilst further south, the Welland offered access through Stamford to the Wash and the East Anglian coast.

As the industrial revolution developed, the transit of goods was speeded up by the digging of canals. Links were made to Loughborough and beyond into the north-west Leicestershire coalfield.

The River Soar navigation was improved and a canal was built up the valley of the Wreake to Melton Mowbray and beyond into Rutland. Alas the canal era was not to last and the new waterways in many cases were abandoned.


There are other rivers draining many other parts

of the county, including no less that two River Sences. One of these flows through the country park at lbstock into the west of the county, whilst the other runs into the River Soar near Wigston.

The River Swift near Lutterworth is reputed to be where the body of the rebel preacher, John Wycliffe, was thrown after his death. Back in the city not everyone is aware of the River Baum which joins the Soar near Aylestone.



In the past Leicester has been accused of turning its back on the River. However the recent growing popularity of our summer Riverside Festival may indicate that interest in our riverfront is growing. *Roger Blackmore*

## No! - To Cold Calling

Two streets in Leicester's West End are the latest to say no to uninvited cold callers.

Residents in Cherryleas Drive and Linkway Gardens have worked with the local police and Leicester City Council trading standards to set up a 'No Cold Calling Zone'.

The voluntary scheme is designed to discourage rogue traders and uninvited door-to-door sellers by sending a clear message that they are not wanted in the area.

Ward councillor and assistant city mayor Sarah Russell said: "No Cold Calling Zones can help give people the confidence to say 'no' to cold callers.

"The zones are there to let cold callers know that they are not wanted in the area and residents will not be doing business with them.

"It's an effective way of helping to deter unscrupulous traders and stopping doorstep crime".

There are now over 70 No Cold Calling Zones in the city.

Jethro's day job is working for the city council's environmental department but his love



## January Police Update

Hello and a Happy New Year to you all. 2016 looks to be a busy year as usual, not only with normal business but also with the changes highlighted in the previous issue.

We have also been made aware by local residents of speeding vehicles around Glenfield Road and Letchworth Road. This is a concern of ours as we have a number of schools in the area and stopping times are greatly increased at higher speeds. We appreciate that this is not likely to be local residents but predominantly people passing through the area. To combat this, we will be utilising our volunteer Special Constables to assist in a speeding operation, which has been conducted before in the area. Where necessary we will be giving words of advice to drivers and issuing tickets to those flouting the law. In previous incidents a number of individuals managed to draw attention to themselves by their high speed and, upon checking the vehicles, they were found to be without insurance or in an unsuitable state. One such vehicle had a virtually bald tyre, which is extremely dangerous as the ability to displace water from the surface means that control will be lost easily.

Towards the end of the year we did see our anticipated spike in burglaries across the wards. We took part in an operation to tackle the problem, through the use of increased high visibility foot and mobile patrols in the area; the use of plain clothes officers patrolling the area and



also utilising of the Mobile Beat Bus. The Beat Bus is essentially an office on wheels that can be parked up in various parts of the community. From here, officers handed out crime prevention advice, took on board any issues brought to them and were generally available for a chat. During the operation we arrested an outstanding suspect for a burglary who was spotted by the plain clothes officers and was swooped in on. In another incident, high visibility officers came across a male who had stolen property on him from a car that had been broken into on a neighbouring area; so he was promptly arrested also. Our patrols will be continuing and if you have any worries then please stop us to have a chat if you see us. Otherwise, events will be added to both the Fosse Ward and Western Park website pages. ### Tony Huxley's Compost Corner

#### 2015 left us with the wettest

**December on record and 2016 didn't begin any drier.** With the soil now holding its maximum water capacity, even after the rain eases, it'll be well into spring before many areas begin to dry.

Record breaking "Hundred Year events" seem to be happening almost annually. We should probably reconsider what constitutes a "Hundred Year event" and alter how we garden accordingly.

If your garden has become a bog, the best course of action is to do nothing! Healthy soil is porous, like a sponge. This allows plant roots to breathe. When the soil is saturated, the roots suffocate and the plant slowly dies. But walking on the waterlogged

soil squashes those spongy holes out of existence. This destroys the soil structure, so even when the ground dries out the plants still struggle.

The soil also loses its absorbency so actually floods even quicker next time! But how to prepare for increased rainfall? If you improve the soil structure, your garden will hold more moisture in dry periods, but drain easier in a downpour. If the ground is compacted, use a fork to break it up. On big lawns, you may want to hire a mechanical aerator then top-dress with



a mixture of sharp sand and topsoil. Adding grit and sand can help drainage, but you'll need a huge amount to alter the nature of a heavy clay soil. Adding plenty of organic matter is the best way to improve the soil. In extreme cases, you may want to consider land-drains, but that can be a major project. Less drastic measures include growing plants in raised beds or building a seasonal wildlife pond to drain the excess. There's also a vast array of trees and plants that can cope with wet soils, from Alders to Zantedeschia. Whatever weather you plan for, expect the unexpected, and lots of it. 
